With the popularity of All Terrain Vehicles (ATVs), emergency responders are routinely finding themselves in situations where they must locate and rescue persons who become injured while riding these vehicles. The remote areas where these individuals often ride adds to the problem by limiting the types of vehicles that we can use to respond to these kinds of emergencies. The purpose of this weekend is to teach emergency personnel to locate, access, stabilize and transport victims of ATV related accidents, and how to use these off road vehicles safely.

The main sessions will be 16 hours each, with students spending Saturday in the classroom, and practicing their newly learned skills outdoors the second day. In addition, we will hold several 4 hour sessions on Friday for those riders who would like to practice their safe riding skills.

Air Evac Aeromedical Services will be hosting a cookout on Saturday at the Logan Airport, to be followed by a landing zone class.

We will be utilizing the Hatfield McCoy Trail System during practical exercises on Sunday. Hatfield McCoy Trails will be issuing annual permits to everyone who signs up for the weekend. For more information on the trail system, go to www.trailsheaven.com

Limited vendor space is available, call for more information.

Special Safety Notice: All participants will need to wear a DOT approved ATV or motorcycle helmet while riding ATVs or UTVs. Firefighter or other types of helmets are not acceptable. Students must also provide some type of eye protection. All students will need an ATV or UTV to ride on the second day of class. If students plan to share a multi-rider vehicle, each rider must have an actual seat - no riding in the bed of the vehicle will be allowed. Students must be at least 18 years of age.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

ATV SAFETY INSTITUTE RIDERCOURSE

Class Size - 8 students per session

This hands on class was developed by the ATV Safety Institute to teach the basic skills needed to ride an ATV safely. Students will practice basic riding skills on an obstacle course, while learning how to correctly perform a pre-ride inspection, minimize impact on the environment, and identify hazards while riding. This four hour class will be held three times on Friday. Each session is limited to 8 riders. All students will need to provide a single rider ATV, DOT approved ATV or motorcycle helmet and eye protection.

ATV SEARCH TACTICS

Class Size - 16 students

Students will spend Saturday in the classroom learning the skills necessary to conduct search operations utilizing ATVs. Topics of discussion include rider safety, sar resources, search operations and tactics, basic equipment, and land navigation. On Sunday, students will practice what they have learned while riding on a section of the Hatfield McCoy Recreational Trail System. All students will need to bring an ATV or UTV to ride, DOT approved ATV or motorcycle helmet, goggles or other eye protection and clothing appropriate for the anticipated weather conditions.

FUNDAMENTALS OF ATV RESCUE

Class Size - 24 students

Students will spend Saturday in the classroom learning basic rescue techniques for rescuing injured riders in a remote setting. Topics of discussion include rope care and construction, knots, simple hauling systems, patient packaging, helmet removal, equipment, and patient transportation techniques. On Sunday, students will practice their new skills outdoors while performing mock rescues on the Hatfield McCoy Recreational Trail System. All students will need to bring an ATV or UTV to ride, DOT approved motorcycle or ATV helmet, goggles or other eye protection, gloves, and clothing appropriate for anticipated weather conditions

INTRODUCTION TO SEARCH MANAGEMENT

Class Size - 16 students

This course will discuss the basic principles for managing a lost person incident and will be geared primarily to command staff with no previous sar training, but is appropriate for anyone with an interest in search and rescue. Topics of discussion include available resources, search operations and tactics, lost person behavior, documentation, and search theory. On Sunday, students will set up a command post and manage a search.
Special Note: ATVs are not required for this class.
