



## EMSA-First Responder Recertification Requirements

To recertify as an EMSA-First Responder in West Virginia, the individual must:

- A. Submit a current complete application form between January 1 and September 30 during the last year of certification.
- B. Submit EMSA – First Responder Continuing Education (CE) Record documenting completed refresher training consisting of:

<u>Topic</u>	<u>Hours</u>
Preparatory	1
Airway Management	2
Patient Assessment	2
Medical	3
Trauma	3
Childbirth/Children	1
Hazmat Awareness	4
<b>Total</b>	<b>16</b>

1. These topics may be presented in a formal course, or through an approved in-squad CE program.
  2. Topics shall be presented using a combination of didactic presentation and hands-on practice.
  3. A maximum of 10 hours of equivalent CECBEMS approved and documented distributive education may be applied to this section.
- C. Possess and submit proof of a current approved CPR credential for the professional rescuer.
  - D. Successfully complete examinations during the final year of certification:
    1. West Virginia written – 50 questions.
    2. West Virginia skills:
      - a. Airway Management
      - b. Bleeding Control/Shock Management
      - c. Cardiac Arrest Management/CPR
      - d. Trauma Patient Assessment and Management
